How To Use Your Subject Planner

This subject planner is a great way to organize what you're going to use to teach various subjects. We've intentionally kept it flexible - there's no need to limit it to just the 4 main academic subjects. You can also use this planner to help organize what your kids need for anything they want to learn; music, drawing, athletics, etc.

Step 1: Print 1 sheet for each subject per child. For example, 2 kids taking 4 subjects would need 8 planning sheets.

Step 2: Fill out the information in the upper right hand corner.

Step 3: Write in what your child will be using in each of the 4 boxes. Note: Don't feel pressure to fill in each box. In fact, if they are all full for each subject, it's possible it is too much.

Step 4: Evaluate - How does your plan look? Do you have time for everything? Enough money to pay for all of it? Does your plan fit with your values and vision for homeschooling?

Step 5: Make iterative changes. Plan on revisiting your planner throughout the year and make changes if you need (or want) to.
